

Graduate Student Organization Senate Meeting Minutes Tuesday, Mar 5, 2024 Meeting @ 5:30 - 7:30 p.m. Virtual (Zoom)

1. Call to order

- a. Determine quorum
 - Vice President Torres determined that quorum had been met. 30 voting Senators were in attendance.
- b. Approval of Minutes: Senate Meeting February 7, 2024
 - i. Senator Feiler moved to approve the minutes without revision.
 - 1. Senator Katherine Miller (Primary, Music) seconded the motion.
 - 2. The February 7, 2024 GSO Senate Meeting Minutes were approved.
- c. Additional items to be added on the agenda -

- i. Vote: Move remaining funds (\$2203.47) from 01-5004 International Student Advocate line into 01-5007 Media Relations Specialist Line to increase Media hours from 5 hours/week to 8 hours/week.
- d. Adoption of today's agenda (eligible for unanimous consent) i.
- e. Fix the time at which to adjourn the senate meeting to 7:30PM (eligible for unanimous consent)
 - i. Senator Kurt Butler (Primary, Electrical and Computer Engineering) moved to fix at 7:30pm the time to adjourn.

Action Items

1. Today's items to vote on:

- a. Vote: Presentation: SAF Increase Proposal
 - i. President Muralli presented a proposal to increase the student activity fee.
 - 1. President Muralli emphasized the lack of reserve funds for the 2024-2025 year, which created a demand to increase the activity in order to maintain the current budget into the next academic year.
 - 2. President Muralli proposed that the activity fee be increased \$15 per semester for all graduate students, which would raise the semesterly fee to \$60.
 - 3. President Muralli warned that if the activity is not increased, the GSO operating budget for 2024-2025 academic year will have to be substantially reduced.
 - ii. Vice President Torres opened the floor to discussion.
 - Senator Daniel Firak (Primary, Physics) sought clarification on the approval process. It was explained that the Senate would have to vote to approve the fee first, and then the GSO membership would approve the fee increase in a referendum on April's election ballot.
 - 2. Senator Andrew Nicoll (Primary, Chemistry) asked Adithya Muralli explain again the fee comparisons for those at peer institutions; Adithya Muralli explained; Andrew argued that it was not necessarily good comparisons to make given that

- each school listed has different student populations with different needs and means
- 3. Andrew given another question -

- 5. Douglas Marr; pressure to have university make up difference
- 6. FRom the Chat:
 - a. Julia Brown a higher budget and better communication is needed to provide more reimbursements for more people
- iii. Vice President Torres called a vote to adopt the "Proposal for Student Activity Fee Increase Referendum."
 - 1. 14 senators voted to adopt the proposal; 10 senators voted not to adopt the proposal; 6 abstained.
 - 2. With a majority of senators voting in favor, the proposal passed. The Student Activity Fee Increase will be presented to the students in a referendum on the coming EC Elections ballot.
- b. **Budget Vote:** Allocate Funds for the Regalia Loan Program *Members of the Treasury requested that the Senate approve the use of up to \$3000 from 01-5310 Departmental Orientation line to fund the Regalia Loan Program.*
 - i. Senator Jose Moscoso Nunez (Primary, Ecology) moved to authorize the use of the requested funds for the Regalia Loan Program.
 - 1. Senator Julia Brown (Primary, English) seconded the motion.
 - 2. No objections were made, and the Senate decided to approve the allocation of funds for the program.
- c. Vote: Event proposals
 - i. Assistant Treasurer Chandrasekhar Thamisetty presented the following event funding proposals for the Senate to approve.
 - 1. Iranian Student Organization Requested \$2000 for Nowruz Event
 - a. Senator Douglas Marr moved to approve the funding request.
 - i. Senator Katherine Miller seconded the motion.
 - ii. No objections were made, and the Senate authorized the disbursement of \$2000 to the Iranian Student Organization for its event.
 - 2. The Graduate Archaeology Society requested \$538.15 from the Speaker Series funding line to host guest speaker Shane Weeks of the Graves Protection Warrior Society.

- a. Senator Jose Msosoco Nunez (Primary, Ecology) moved to approve the disbursement of \$538.15 to the Graduate Archaeology Society for their event.
 - Senator Daniel Firak (Primary, Physics) seconded the motion.
 - ii. No objections were made. The Senate authorized the disbursement of the requested funds.
- 3. Graduate Students from the Department of Hispanic Languages and Literature requested \$500 from the Speaker Series funding line for a guest lecture "Quadrinhos!: Comic Books in Brazil"
 - a. Senator Henrry Ibanez (HLL) moved to approve the request.
 - Senator Jose Moscoso Nunez seconded the motion.
- 4. Piano Projects event
 - a. Motion to amend budget for this event, and to approve ALL previous event proposals
 - i. Seconded by Jacquline martin
 - ii. Moved to vote
 - 1. 18 yes votes
 - a. No nays
 - 2. The Senate formally approved all event proposals.
- d. Senator Kurt Butler moved to extend the meeting to 7:45pm.
 - i. Senator Valentina Pucci seconded the motion.
 - ii. The meeting was extended to 7:45pm.
- e. Vote: Move remaining funds (\$2203.47) from 01-5004 International Student Advocate line into 01-5007 Media Relations Specialist Line to increase Media hours from 5 hours/week to 8 hours/week.
 - Senator Jose Moscoso Nunez (Primary, Ecology) moved to authorize this reallocation of funds, with the condition that the reallocation occur only if Vice President Rick Gatteau recertifies the budget.
 - 1. Senator Daniel Firak (Primary, Physics) seconded the motion.
 - 2. Vice President Torres called a vote.
 - a. 15 senators voted to approve the reallocation of funds, with the condition that the altered budget be presented to Vice President Rick Gatteau for recertification.
 - b. 4 senators abstained.
 - c. The motion passed.
